

Keeping our pupils

SAFE, HAPPY & WELL

Sending your child to nursery or school for the first time is a big step for any parent or carer, and we know that when you drop them off at the school gates every morning, you want to know they are well looked-after. We pride ourselves on fostering a warm and welcoming environment for your child - where they can make friends, have fun and flourish.

PASTORAL CARE

We strive to create a supportive, caring and happy environment where effective learning can take place. Class teachers ensure parents are regularly updated on any issues that are preventing their child from learning and they take particular care with children who are new to the school environment, during the transition between key stages and when pupils are preparing to move on to secondary school. We work closely with parents and carers to put effective support structures in place for every pupil.

BEHAVIOUR

Children make choices about how they behave. It is the responsibility of us all to guide and coach pupils to make the right choices. We adopt a positive approach towards managing behaviour, encouraging pupils to live by our Star values and six simple Golden Rules, which encourage honesty, hard work, respect and taking responsibility.

SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding is of paramount importance and we have robust systems and policies to ensure that our pupils are protected from harm. Our staff members have a wealth of safeguarding expertise and work alongside a range of external agencies to enhance our provision.

PUPILS WITH PARTICULAR NEEDS

Outstanding educational opportunities for all are at the heart of our mission. We take a personalised approach, with each pupil at the centre of a personal learning plan. It is important that pupils with special educational needs are properly identified, assessed and supported and that the support is tailored to each child's particular needs. In deciding what those needs are and how we can support the pupil to overcome any 'barriers to learning' arising from those needs, we will work closely with the pupil and their family. This 3-way partnership is essential in making sure that all pupils make the best possible progress whilst at our Academy.



In 2019 98% of pupils achieved the expected standard in Maths, 89% achieved the expected standard in Reading and 88% achieved the expected standard in Writing.

Achieving & sustaining

EXCELLENCE

We strive for excellence in everything we do and ensure our pupils develop, secure and master the skills required to meet - and exceed - age-related expectations. Our focus on educational excellence, character development and service to communities creates a well-rounded and vibrant curriculum where pupils develop the academic, social and personal skills they need to achieve success from a young age. Every pupil is special and we regularly identify, reward and celebrate their many successes.

CURRICULUM

Our curriculum is designed to foster thought, curiosity and a desire for learning in all pupils. We prioritise learning in literacy, numeracy, languages, humanities and science. Our pupils are required to read extensively from a broad range of high quality and increasingly challenging materials across all disciplines. We have incorporated play, active learning and extended classroom activities into the curriculum to ensure that pupils can use and apply their developing knowledge. We draw extensively on the National Curriculum, Core Knowledge Sequence (UK), Inspire Maths and the RWI phonics programme to provide rigour to our curriculum. We galvanise our pupils' imaginations and ensure the subjects we teach are further enriched by educational trips, inspirational visitors and targeted home learning.

ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING

Each pupil has a personalised learning journey designed to engage, challenge and support them. Parents receive half-termly report cards which include goals for children to work towards. Where a child is not making expected progress, we meet with parents to discuss obstacles to learning and ensure early action is taken to address any areas of concern.

HOMEWORK

Learning at home is an essential part of a good education. The regular setting of appropriate, enjoyable, challenging and differentiated homework contributes to pupils' overall learning experience and is essential for pupils to reach their potential.

LEADERSHIP SPECIALISM

Our leadership specialism provides our pupils with a variety of fun-filled and engaging learning experiences. Programmes in sports, creative arts and social enterprise build character and provide opportunities for making a difference in the local community. These programmes are supplemented by enrichment opportunities – Leadership Academies – aimed at developing key leadership skills and specific interests and talents.

The Academy currently runs a 78-place nursery, which caters for 39 pupils during the morning session and 39 pupils during the afternoon session.

Our nursery offers a high quality early years provision with a personalised approach. Through our fun, engaging and creative curriculum, we ensure all of the children in our care work towards successfully achieving the Early Learning Goals and are well-prepared to make the transition to primary school.

Our play-based curriculum covers the seven fundamental areas of learning identified by the Department for Education and will help all children develop key literacy, numeracy, personal and social skills, as well as a positive and proactive approach to learning.





OUR ACADEMY

ACADEMY HOURS AND ATTENDANCE

School begins at 8.55am and finishes at 3.00pm for pupils in Key Stage 1 and Lower Key Stage 2.

For pupils in Years 5 and 6, school begins at 8.50am and finishes at 3.00pm. Reception children start slightly later, beginning the school day at 9.00am and finishing at 3.00pm.

Our nursery pupils have the choice of attending a morning session, which runs from 8.30am-11.30am, or an afternoon session, which runs from 12.15pm-3.15pm.

Our Breakfast Club is open daily from 8.00am to meet the needs of today's busy parents.

We encourage all pupils to work towards 100% attendance and set a minimum attendance target of 97% per year. Excellent attendance is celebrated and recognised on a regular basis, particularly during our end-of-term Awards Assembly.

UNIFORM

Pupils are proud to wear the Academy uniform. The uniform is smart and reflects our aspirations for our pupils to become the leaders of tomorrow.

LUNCH ARRANGEMENTS

The Academy is committed to ensuring that pupils are offered a varied selection of appetising school meals, all of which meet national nutritional standards. By providing our pupils with access to a healthy, balanced diet, we encourage them to develop sensible eating habits and give them the fuel they need to remain attentive and focused throughout the school day.

ADMISSIONS
